# **President's Report 2025**

The 2025 season is one we can all be immensely proud of. As a Committee, our goals were to:

- 1. Strengthen our inclusive, family-friendly club culture.
- 2. Achieve strong growth in our Under 12 age groups to secure future club continuity.
- 3. Field as many competitive teams as possible each week and build overall player depth.
- 4. Secure grants and sponsorships to provide a solid financial foundation for club activities.
- 5. Host engaging social events to build club spirit and strengthen member connections.
- 6. Improve our online communications website, newsletter, social media, and automated payments process.
- 7. Continue to enhance the canteen as the social hub of our club.

### **Club Culture and Community**

This year we further strengthened our club culture, which shone through in the extraordinary support from players, parents, and volunteers across every roster and event.

What stood out most was the number of young players stepping up as junior coaches, the teamwork in our canteen rosters, and the spirit our teams displayed both in victory and defeat.

That ethos — respect, humility, and support - is shared by every member. A heartfelt thanks goes to our Committee, who worked tirelessly and often invisibly behind the scenes. Special mention to the leaders of our coaching groups, Clinton Lander and Meredith Carre for setting the standard on and off the field.

It's no surprise that other clubs have noticed our culture - I had many approach me throughout the season to say, "You're doing something special." We're proud to be building something meaningful, and we're well-positioned for an even stronger 2026.

### Junior Development - Building the Future

Post-COVID, our junior numbers were low, as they were for many clubs across Victoria. But thanks to a highly focused Junior Attraction Strategy - including the Glen Iris Schools Lacrosse Day, in-school clinics, "come and try" sessions, indoor coaching, parent meet-and-greets, and a gear sponsorship program - we turned that around.

The result: in 2025 we proudly fielded four boys' and one girls' Under 12 teams - an incredible foundation for our future.

This effort was driven by Tony Hollenkamp, Doug Fox, Nik Hadaway, Cass Richards, Nick Barlow, and myself and co-ordinated a volunteer group of over 50 club members

A special thank you to the Supporters Club, who funded 50% of the new equipment for new players. This contribution alongside contributions from our sponsors, removed that a key financial barrier to participation for new players and families

# **Team Strength and Participation**

2025 saw the welcome return of three senior men's teams and the continuation of two senior women's teams - a testament to our depth, commitment, and adaptability.

Players showed remarkable flexibility, stepping in to cover injuries, holidays, and competition clashes, ensuring Camberwell fielded strong sides every week.

To every player, coach, manager, umpire, scorer, and volunteer - from those marking lines to managing gear bags - your efforts make this club thrive.

It truly takes an army of passionate people, and I thank every one of you.

### **Grants and Sponsorship**

# Treasurer's Report — Financial Year: Nov 2024 to Oct 2025

Camberwell Lacrosse Club recorded an improved financial performance for FY25 (year ended 31 October 2025). Total income increased and, with controlled expenses, the club moved from a net loss in FY24 to a net surplus in FY25.

### Income

Total income: \$74,893.13 (FY25). An increase of \$2,737.99 from the previous year. Key Income streams include:

# <u>Fundraising:</u> \$34,573.30 (FY25).

This income number is made up of Canteen Sales, Fundraising events and Presentation night. Canteen Sales increased from \$22,115.58 to \$27,908.66 – a 26% increase. Fundraising events increased from \$3,957.65 to \$8,653.64 – a 118% increase.

# Grants & sponsorship: \$10,350.00 (FY25).

Income from grants and sponsorships decreased from \$10,350 to \$5,650. Nick Barlow led the Grant and Sponsorships this year, securing grants from Bendigo Bank, as well as securing ASV Wadeson Pty Ltd and Jefferson Insurance Pty Ltd as our club sponsors for the year.

# <u>Subscription Fees:</u> \$34,925.28 (FY25).

Subscription income fell by \$2,506.44. The reason for this was that a portion of the annual fees was payable directly to Lacrosse Victoria. This indicates that we had more players this year in comparison to last, and with the new registration process, we have performed better than in the previous year by having more registration money received than fees paid to Lacrosse Victoria.

### **Expenses**

Total Expenses: \$48,160.23 (FY25). This represents a decrease of \$20,277.68 from the previous financial year. Most expense categories remained relatively stable, with one key exception — Lacrosse Victoria fees, which fell significantly due to the new player registration process introduced this year.

Another factor affecting the total is Ground Fees, which have not yet been invoiced by Boroondara City Council. This delay has temporarily lowered reported expenses. Once those fees are received and included, total expenses will adjust accordingly.

Even accounting for the expected Ground Fees, the Club is still projected to record a healthy profit for the 2025 financial year.

# **Net Result**

- Gross Profit (FY25): 81%
- Previous Year (FY24): 91%
- Net surplus (FY25): \$12,375.20 (year ended 31 October 2025)
- Previous year (FY24) net loss of \$2,799.35
- This represents an improvement of \$15,174.55 compared with FY24.

# **Balance Sheet**

The club's total assets increased by \$13,828.14. This is representative of a total increase in cash for the year as well as a contribution yet to come from the Supporters Club to help offset Junior recruiting, coaching and equipment expenses.

# Conclusion

FY25 delivered a strong turnaround for Camberwell Lacrosse Club, with higher income, a substantial reduction in key expenses (notably Lacrosse Victoria fees), and a net surplus of \$12,375.20 as at 31 October 2025. The club's cash and overall asset position improved, though sundry receivables have risen and should be actively managed. Continued focus on membership attraction, retention and targeted sponsorship/fundraising will help sustain this positive momentum into FY26.

# **State League Men 2025**

After losing Lee Davis as a fantastic SL coach from the Camberwell senior lacrosse program, the search to find a replacement coach proved very difficult and with the pre-season underway which was started off by the players and Nik Hadaway. The decision was made for myself to step in to fill the previous big shoes.

Coming off a strong 2024 we had lost 4 International players from the previous season and also the captain through a significant knee injury, opened up a great opportunity for a group of graduating U/18 players to step up to a full men's senior program

The club was restricted to 2 import players due to ladder position, but very lucky to recruit 2 international players Tommy Rogan (attack) from Dartmouth and Eric Suits (Goal keeper) from Lynn University. Also, through the club website we were able to recruit Tom Herold from the US who relocated to Aus with his Australian fiancé who proved to be a steady regular contributor to the attack line in State League.

With an uncertain decision if we could sustain 3 senior teams for 2025, we took the risk which proved successful, proving a great start to the season. We regularly had 30 players at training which helped develop

the club, but as the cold weather arrived, we sustained the same issues in most seasons with numbers progressively dropping off.

We started the season on fire with strong wins in the first 2 rounds against Malvern and Eltham, then a huge overtime win against last year's premiers. We then plateaued, with a few difficult losses putting us in a midtable position, but remaining in the top 6 to play off for the State League finals.

The season was riddled with a few injuries and key personnel taking extended holidays making games in the second round of the season leaving us in 6<sup>th</sup> position by the end of the season, with 7 wins and 8 losses. Having Eric playing in reserves the first half of the season he stepped up big in the second half of the season filling in for an injured Sean, but with 2 games to go and an opportunity to qualify for reserves we were fortunate to recruit a 3<sup>rd</sup> goalkeeper Lachlan Nash (trained by Sean in the US) who will hopefully be a key part of the club in the future years

The team had 23 players rotate through during the season with a few one game wonders who helped out which the team appreciated the support. We fielded 16 in most games which was great but did not always have many other players in lower divisions pushing into the team, which is something we need to work on to strengthen the team. But we did find a core group of U/18 players across the 3 senior teams. Angus Leslie, Alexander Hadaway, Orlando Raffaelli and Ben Rogan playing all available State League games and growing in confidence as the season progressed. The club was lucky enough having Ben Rogan be selected in the U20 Australian team who won a bronze medal in South Korea. Well Done, Ben!

Our offence worked well with the inclusion of 2 new players Tom Herold and Tommy Rogan joining the steady Eddy Mizrahi scoring 95 goals and assisting 27, Tommy finishing 6<sup>th</sup> overall in State League scoring with 41 goals 19 assists and Eddy finishing 7<sup>th</sup> with 33 goals and 11 assists.

It was also great having a few older heads driving the team with Al Gloutnay in defence and Joel Easson still proving he has the ability to run the ball all day and score goals, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in scoring for the team.

Thanks to captains Henry Farkas & Aaron Hussain, with Al Gloutnay & Sean Aaron filling the leadership roles. Al Rubins was a great support while injured, stepping into an assistant coaching role and learning along the way how to fill a different role supporting and leading the team. He is definitely looking forward to getting back on the park next year. A special thanks to Miron Mizrahi as team manager and Lisa Lander as the team scorer.

Every player had their standout moments: Tom, who couldn't throw a ball at the start of the season; Ollie, who grew in confidence; Archer, who learned to use his body and strength effectively; Spencer, who became a supportive teammate; and Hudson, who quickly began exceeding his own expectations, possibly on track to be the next Sean Aaron.

But most of all, I was proud of Stirling's incredible growth and leadership. At the beginning, he told me he'd never won an award or been the best at anything. By the end of the season, he had become our strongest asset, a leader, a role model, and proof that belief and hard work can change everything.

# **State League Women**



2025 began with a renewed commitment to raising standards at training and in terms of the expectations we had of each other. Trinity Meachem, Izzy Hodder and Cass Richards led some pre-season conversations as a senior cohort to this effect, and new practices were introduced in terms of communication and personal responsibility as members of the State League team in particular.

Pre-season began in February with a few potential new senior recruits, with one of them following through to play SLR (Sienna). Rhyannon Bergin was a very unfortunate loss to the club this season, having continued to have significant injury issues that prevented her from playing at all in 2025. In addition our SL goalie form 2024 Georgia Wiles was reluctantly forced into an early retirement after her third concussion at the end of 2024. This left us in a difficult position with our 2024 SLR goalie Rachael Brown needing to step into the breach for us which she did courageously, as did our 2024 U17 goalie Ella Jamieson who took on the SLR goalie role. Ella too had been seriously concussed at the end of the 2024 season with symptoms continuing for months. Concussion and the rules surrounding shots to the head are an area that needs to be brought up for review as we move forward. In addition the lack of goal keeping coaching support for the women's program was a challenge, and a clear area for growth if we are to protect our goalies as well as see improvement.

On a positive note the work that was done in the offseason in 2024 in overseas recruiting paid off with the addition of Katie Giglio to our roster. Katie is a graduate of Mercer University and joined us in March of this year, billeted jointly by the Meachem and Bugeja families. Katie's contributions this season were outstanding both as a player but more importantly as a teammate, and we are very grateful to the billeting families and to Katie, who seamlessly and with great positivity joined the Camberwell clan and added great value both as a player and as the u17 co-coach.

In addition Eleni Magoran joined us in 2025 hot off the Australian Women's Box World Cup and added great value, despite needing to miss a large chunk of the season for family reasons.

On the field Camberwell continued to have competitive matches in phases and in an improvement from 2024 finished the season with one win in a nailbiter against Malvern. All three of our matches with Malven

were competitive, and our final game against Footscray (2025 SL Premiers) while a loss, saw us right in the match at halftime down 7-5.

Significant improvements from a number of players and a stellar rookie captaincy by Trinity Meachem, who led with grit and courage in every match, saw us still positive and building despite continued losses. It is a huge credit to this group that they continue to put their heart and body on the line week in and week out and remain so positive and focused on improvement.

Huge thanks to our captain Trinity Meachem and vice-captains Izzy Hodder and Bridget Hogan who did a fantastic job in keeping morale and standards high despite the challenges of each week. In addition a big thank you to Anne Hodder who umpired the bulk of our games – we are so fortunate to have an umpire of this quality as a part of our team.
